SCHOOL UNIFORM REMINDER

Many thanks for your continuing support in sending your child(ren) to school in such smart uniform. May I remind parents that no earrings (or any other jewellery) can be worn by pupils. Girls may wear smart school trousers, grey or black tights (white with summer uniform) or grey, black or white socks. However, leggings or footless tights are not part of our school uniform and should not be worn. No make-up or nail varnish is allowed.

THE IMPORTANCE OF PUNCTUALITY

At the start of each school day it is vitally important that all our pupils arrive on time. There is a generous window of opportunity at St Richard's - between 8.30am and 8.58am. Punctuality is essential as it sets the tone for the whole day, reduces pupil anxiety and maximises learning opportunities.

At the end of the day we always expect parental punctuality – picking your child(ren) up on time. We are currently keeping a record of parents who are persistently late in picking up after school. We reserve the right to charge parents for the cost of the additional child-care which this inconvenience and lack of punctuality inevitably incurs.

FLU VACCINATION INFORMATION

Flu is not to be confused with the sniffles. It is a highly contagious and potentially serious viral illness. We are offering a vaccination session at our school on Friday 4th October 2019. Please complete and return your consent form to ensure that your child is vaccinated and to avoid leaving your child at risk.
