GETTING READY FOR WINTER UNIFORM

Many thanks to all our parents and carers for your continuing support and co-operation in ensuring that children come to school in smart, full school uniform every day. As the October half-term holiday draws closer, I want to remind all our parents that, from Monday 4th November, all our pupils <u>must</u> be in winter uniform. This consists of:

GIRLS' WINTER UNIFORM: Dark grey skirt or pinafore dress, blue blouse, school tie, school sweatshirt or cardigan (plain navy, preferably with the school logo. No other logo is allowed). Girls are allowed to wear grey or black tights or grey, black or white socks. Girls may wear dark grey school trousers. No boots are to be worn in school.

BOYS' WINTER UNIFORM: Dark grey school trousers, blue shirt, school tie, school sweatshirt (plain navy, preferably with the school logo. No other logo is allowed). St Richard's school ties are available from the school office

priced £3 each.

APPLYING FOR A SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACE FOR 2020 Parents of pupils now in Year 6 are required to apply for their secondary school place for September 2020 by the closing date of **31st October 2019**. All Year 6 pupils ought to have brought home a flyer from Manchester City Council with details of high schools' open evenings/events this half-term.
