#### CHANGES TO YOUR CHILD'S ANNUAL SCHOOL REPORT

On Friday 12<sup>th</sup> July, parents/carers must collect their child's annual school report **directly** from their child's classteacher (face-toface and hand-to-hand) at the end of the school day. If reports are not collected in this way on that day, they may be picked up from the school office before we break up for the summer holidays.

This year there will also be a letter in the envelope with your child's annual school report which will let you know which class and classteacher your child will be with next academic year.

#### CHANGES TO HOW PUPILS AND PARENTS/CARERS GAIN ACCESS TO ST RICHARD'S EACH MORNING

Pupils and parents/carers are no longer able to enter the school site before 8.30am (pupils attending Breakfast Club will be able to enter school between 8am and 8.15am but only via the main gate on Wilpshire Avenue). Sutcliffe Avenue gates now open at 8.30am until 9am and the main gate on Wilpshire Avenue remains open until 9.05am. The Norton Avenue gate is no longer open in the mornings.

## SAFE AND CONSIDERATE PARKING

Parents and carers must never park or drop off children on the zig-zag yellow lines outside school's entrances. Traffic Enforcement Officers are patrolling the roads around St Richard's at the moment in an attempt to ensure safer driving and parking around school.
