FLU VACCINATION INFORMATION

A message from Intrahealth (the flu immunisation team who had arranged to visit our school on Friday 4th October):

We have been in conversation with both the manufacturers and delivery companies in connection with the children's flu vaccinations and they have informed us that there is national delay in us receiving the immunisations. This, unfortunately, means that we will be unable to visit your school on the date planned as the vaccinations will not have arrived with the team by the time your appointment was arranged. This decision has not been taken lightly, as an immunisation team we pride ourselves on being reliable, as we understand that schools can be very busy and sometimes struggle to change at short notice. We can only apologise for any inconvenience caused to your staff and parents however the issue is completely out of our control.

PUPIL USE OF MOBILE PHONES IN SCHOOL

Only pupils in Year 6 who come to school unaccompanied by an adult may bring a mobile phone to school. This is on the following conditions:

- School has received written permission from a parent in advance of the phone being brought to school.
- The phone is turned off as soon as the pupil comes onto school premises.
- The phone is handed to a Y6 staff member immediately on entry to the pupil's classroom.
- The phone is only turned back on as the pupil leaves the school site.
- The phone is never misused (eg to film or photograph other pupils or staff, use social media/the internet, etc).

It can be accessed on the school's website every Thursday afternoon and a small number of paper copies will be available in the school office after school on Thursdays - but parents will have to come in to request a paper copy on a weekly basis.
