Girls are allowed to wear grey or black tights or grey, black or white socks. Girls may wear dark grey school trousers. No boots are to be worn in school.

BOYS' WINTER UNIFORM: Dark grey school trousers, blue shirt, school tie, school sweatshirt (plain navy, preferably with the school logo. No other logo is allowed). St Richard's school ties are available from the school office priced £3 each.
