As mentioned previously, personal hygiene is the most important way we can help contain COVID-19. Please help us by sharing simple and effective hand hygiene messages with your child(ren) and please practise effective handwashing with them at home.

EFFECTIVE HAND WASHING

In assemblies last week (and in class this week) all children have been shown how to wash their hands carefully. Please help to reinforce their ability to wash their hands thoroughly by regularly checking at home that your children are:

- Washing their hands with soap and water
- Washing fronts and backs of hands (and wrists)
- Washing in between fingers
- Washing tips of fingers in the palms of hands
- Washing thumbs.

Hands should be washed for the length of time it takes to sing 'Happy Birthday to You' twice - then should be rinsed and dried. This is something we should all be doing in order to stop the transmission of germs.

HAND SANITISER GEL

Pupils are not permitted to bring their own hand sanitiser gel to school. Pupils have access to soap and water in school and this is an effective way to help prevent the spread of germs if used correctly and as described above.
