## RE-OPENING OF SCHOOL TO YEAR 1 PUPILS

On Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June, Year 1 children will be able to return to school from 9am until 3pm **as long as parents have already informed us in advance** (the closing date for starting next Monday was yesterday, 17<sup>th</sup> June). Children will be taught in groups ('bubbles') of 10 pupils maximum until school breaks up for the summer holidays on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July. Year 1 bubbles will be taught in the St Richard's Building. The arrangements are:

- Y1 children must arrive at the **main Sutcliffe Avenue gate** between 9am and 9.09am each morning. They may be accompanied by a maximum of one parent or carer. This gate will be locked at exactly 9.10am every morning.
- Each child and their one parent/carer may have to queue. If this is the case, you must use the yellow floor markings on the pavement on Sutcliffe Avenue in order to maintain social distancing.
- Y1 children will exit from the **main Sutcliffe Avenue gate** at 3pm every day and must be picked up on time by one parent/carer, observing social distancing.
- Children must be in full school uniform (but must not wear a school tie).
- Children may bring a coat, and a packed lunch in disposable packaging (if they usually have a packed lunch from home). Otherwise, school will be providing packed lunches to all pupils in Year 1 who attend.
- Children must bring nothing else to school (named, individual water bottles will be provided by school).

Please read this very carefully in advance of your child's return. Please also read the **Headteacher's letter on the wider re-opening of St Richard's school - 29th May 2020** and **Revised School Procedures**. All three contain essential information. By sending your child back to school you are agreeing to abide by all the conditions and rules contained in these three documents.

## REOPENING OF SCHOOL TO RECEPTION PUPILS

It is currently still our plan that, from Monday 29<sup>th</sup> June, Reception pupils will return to school from 9.30am until 3.30pm until school breaks up for the summer holidays on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July. They will be taught in groups ('bubbles') of 12 pupils maximum. Reception pupils will be taught in the EYFS Building.

**In the case of Y6, Y1 and Reception children, they will only be allowed to attend St Richard's if parents have informed us in advance via email or phone (the weekly closing date is 3pm on the Wednesday before the Monday that children are due to return).**

No other year groups (including Nursery) will be able to return to St Richard's until after the Summer holidays. You will not be pressured to send your child back to school this term and the government has said that there will be no fines issued to parents of children not attending school. Please note:

- All **Clinically Extremely Vulnerable** pupils are required to self-isolate and must not attend school.
- All pupils who live with a person who is Clinically Extremely Vulnerable must also not attend school.
- All pupils, or persons within their household that have COVID 19 symptoms must not attend school.

I need to make it clear that, sadly, if you send your child back to St Richard's in June, it will be a very different experience from the one they are used to.

## CONFIRMATION FOR OUR CURRENT YEAR 6 PUPILS

A message from Fr Michael Deas (Assistant priest St Catherine's, Didsbury and St Ambrose, Chorlton):

*The Diocese of Salford has changed the age at which children receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to when they are in Year 8. So your child is due to be Confirmed in Easter 2022. Confirmation is the next sacramental milestone after First Holy Communion, when a person 'confirms' their faith and is strengthened by the Holy Spirit. All the preparation for this Sacrament will be organised on a local deanery level, or in your local parish. At this time, we are just contacting you to make you aware and so that you can register your interest. So, if you and your child are interested in taking part in the preparation and receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, please fill out and submit the attached Google Form and your parish priest will contact you with more information in the future.*
