WE BREAK UP FOR THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS TOMORROW

St Richard's will close to all pupils (including vulnerable children and children of key workers) tomorrow, Friday 17th July for the Summer holidays. **This will be a non-uniform day in school.** School will re-open to pupils from Reception to Year 6 on Thursday 3rd September. Different arrangements apply to our new Nursery children's staggered start and parents will be notified of these as soon as possible, in a letter through the post.

FULL REOPENING OF SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2020

We will provide the most up to date information on how school will re-open in September 2020 in two ways:

- In the envelope with your child's annual school report there will also be information about which class teacher your child will be with next academic year as well as which room, which building and which gate they must enter and exit school from.
- On Tuesday 21st July we will place two new documents on the home page of the school website. These are the Risk Assessment for Whole School Reopening September 2020 and Whole School Reopening Procedures September 2020.

It will be vital that all parents read both new documents before children return to school in September. It will also be important that parents and carers continue to access the home page of the school website periodically over the summer holidays just in case we need to deliver urgent, updated or more detailed information. There will be no weekly newsletter over the summer break and no monitoring of emails.

PLEASE PROVIDE YOUR CHILD WITH A NAMED WATER BOTTLE

From September 2020 onwards, each child in school must bring in their own name-labelled (Sharpie pen would do it) water bottle to drink from in class. This is in order to limit the chance of the spread of the virus.

BREAKFAST CLUB SUSPENDED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

As a consequence of the many other considerations and adaptions we are making at St Richard's in order for it to be safe for all adults and staff to return in September 2020, we are suspending our Breakfast Club until further notice. We have no idea how long this suspension will be in place for and therefore we advise parents to seek alternative before-school care provision for the foreseeable future.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP FROM SEPTEMBER

In order to reduce congestion around school from September 2020 onwards, we are asking that only one parent/carer drops off and collects their child(ren) from the relevant school gate. You may wish to encourage your older KS2 children to walk to/from school by themselves. Families and pupils that have no alternative but to use wider public transport are asked to read the Government's guidance on safer travel guidance for passengers

THE SUMMER READING CHALLENGE 2020, 'SILLY SQUAD'

The annual Summer Reading Challenge has launched early this year. It is aimed at children aged 4-11 and will run over the summer until early September. The challenge is very different as it will not involve a library visit or reading books from the local library. Children join online at www.sillysquad.org.uk and can read any books (from home, from school, e-books etc). There is no minimum number of books to read (previously it was 6). Manchester Libraries will be offering daily online content Monday to Friday from 1st July. This includes a weekly 'Draw with Me' with Nick Sharratt, craft sessions, poetry and storytelling. There will also be a Book Review competition.

RETURNING READING BOOKS TO SCHOOL

At the start of lockdown, we issued two reading books to almost every child at St Richard's (that's almost a thousand reading books). When children return to school in September we would like children to bring this reading stock back to school with them. For children who will not be returning to St Richard's (eg – Year 6 leavers) we would also like these books to be returned. This can be in person for Y6 currently attending or via younger siblings in September if this is an option. If neither option is available, we would still like books to be brought back either in person by a parent or posted to school as soon as possible. Many thanks in advance.

FULL SCHOOL UNIFORM FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

At St Richard's RC Primary School, children will be expected to dress neatly and in uniform at all times from September 2020 onwards. Uniforms will not need to be cleaned any more often than usual, nor do they need to be cleaned using methods which are different from normal. We thank all parents and carers in advance for their invaluable support in ensuring that our school uniform policy will always be strictly adhered to. Uniform is available to purchase from MCS Stores in Didsbury or Barbara's Uniforms on Longsight market. MCS now has an online ordering facility.
