## **WE BREAK UP FOR THE SUMMER ON FRIDAY 17<sup>th</sup> JULY**

The Secretary of State for Education confirmed yesterday that the Government are not asking schools to open over the summer holidays, and there is no expectation that schools should open for vulnerable children and children of critical workers over this period. I can therefore confirm that St Richard's will close to **all pupils** on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July and will not re-open to pupils until Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020 at the earliest.

## **YOUR CHILD'S ANNUAL SCHOOL REPORT**

Before we break up on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July, you should receive an annual school report (in an envelope, through the post) which details your child's effort and progress in relation to the subjects that they studied - as well as comments on their general progress and behaviour - from September 2019 until we closed the school due to the pandemic. We also intend providing the most up to date and detailed information on how school will re-open in September 2020 in the envelope too. For this reason, it may arrive quite close to (or even soon after) Friday 17<sup>th</sup> July. It will be vitally important that parents and carers continue to access the home page of the school website periodically over the summer holidays just in case we need to deliver even more updated information this way.

## **RE-OPENING OF SCHOOL TO MORE PUPILS**

We now have some pupils from Reception, Year One and Year Six in school, alongside children of key workers and vulnerable pupils. No other year groups (including Nursery) will be able to return to St Richard's until after the Summer holidays. You will not be pressured to send your child back to school this term and the government has said that there will be no fines issued to parents of children not attending school during the period of school closure in this academic year.

The Government has yet to send any detailed guidance to schools about next academic year, which is due to start in September. You may have seen headlines about the Government's commitment that all school children in all year groups will return to school in September 2020. Events in Leicester this week have shown that things may not be that straightforward. Rest assured that we will communicate our plans for September as soon as we can, following the issuing of more detailed guidance from the Government.

**Any more Y6, Y1 and Reception children will only be allowed to attend St Richard's if parents have informed us in advance via email or phone (the weekly closing date is 3pm on the Wednesday before the Monday that children are due to return). Please DO NOT bring your child to school unless you have received confirmation from school following your application.**

Details of how parents can make this application are contained in **Headteacher's letter on the wider re-opening of St Richard's school - 29th May 2020**, a link to which is on the homepage of the school website.

Please read this very carefully in advance of your child's return. Please also read the **Revised School Procedures**. All three documents contain essential information. By sending your child back to school you are agreeing to abide by all the conditions and rules contained in these three documents.

## **ST RICHARD'S CHURCH TO REMAIN CLOSED**

Father Dever has asked me to let all our parents and carers know that St Richard's Church remains closed for the time being. St Mary's RC Church in Levenshulme is open for private prayer three times a week (Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday) from 9.30am until 11am. Neither church will be resuming the celebration of public Mass from 4<sup>th</sup> July. As Father Dever states, *'It is important for all of us to realise that there is no obligation to attend Sunday Mass in these very difficult times. The time will come, hopefully soon, when we can once again celebrate the Eucharist together in our churches. We have come a long way in our journey through the crisis but our guiding thought must always be the safety of others and ourselves.'*

## **CONFIRMATION FOR OUR CURRENT YEAR 6 PUPILS**

A message from Fr Michael Deas (Assistant priest St Catherine's, Didsbury and St Ambrose, Chorlton):

*The Diocese of Salford has changed the age at which children receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to when they are in Year 8. So your child is due to be Confirmed in Easter 2022. Confirmation is the next sacramental milestone after First Holy Communion, when a person 'confirms' their faith and is strengthened by the Holy Spirit. All the preparation for this Sacrament will be organised on a local deanery level, or in your local parish. At this time, we are just contacting you to make you aware and so that you can register your interest. So, if you and your child are interested in taking part in the preparation and receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, please fill out and submit the attached Google Form and your parish priest will contact you with more information in the future.*
