ST RICHARD'S IS CLOSED THIS FRIDAY AND NEXT MONDAY

St Richard's RC Primary School will be closed to all pupils this Friday (20th November) and on Monday 23rd November 2020. These are allocated INSET days and no pupils should come to school on these days.

COVID 19 UPDATE FROM SCHOOL

We were delighted to welcome Reception 2 back to school today. Class 9 are having to self-isolate following a confirmed case of COVID-19 in their bubble this week. They will return to school on Monday 30th November. Since this (and up until this morning) we have had no further bubble closures as a result of COVID-19 in school.

NEW COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS ARE IN FORCE

New national restrictions came into force on Thursday 5th November for 4 weeks (until Wednesday 2nd December) as a result of rapidly rising COVID-19 cases nationally. <u>Schools</u> (<u>including ours</u>) remain open. It is very important for children to continue to attend St Richard's, in order to support their wellbeing and educational progress. Senior clinicians advise that school is the best place for children to be. At St Richard's we have a wide range of protective measures in place to keep everyone as safe as possible.

There are many things that we can all do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19. Along with no household mixing and the recommended hand-washing and hygiene measures, **please keep two metres apart at the school gates.** We have a sign on Norton Avenue with these very words on it. Despite the challenges involved, it is very important that we all give each other as much space as possible during drop-off and pick-up times in order to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

NO CHRISTMAS CONCERTS IN SCHOOL THIS YEAR

Just a reminder that we have taken the sad decision not to have Christmas concerts and performances in school this year. This is unfortunate but necessary during a time of pandemic when we are seeking to minimise mixing in order to halt the spread of COVID-19.

You must apply on time to be considered for your preferred schools. **Having a Nursery place at St Richard's in no way guarantees a place in our Reception class. Please apply on time.**

If you are a family with no recourse to public funds but would like to apply for temporary free school meals, then please contact our school office on 0161 224 5552 <u>in complete confidence</u> and we will provide you with an application form which you will then be able to send back to us.

TAKE EXTRA CARE WALKING HOME

It has been reported to us that an act of theft took place in Crowcroft Park last night (the police have been informed). Now that darker afternoons and evenings are definitely with us, it is vital that parents and pupils are extra vigilant and careful on the journey home from school for all kinds of reasons – including personal safety. Please take extra care everyone.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

Due to the inconsiderate and sometimes dangerous driving and parking habits of a tiny minority of our parents and carers, we are inviting MCC Traffic Enforcement Officers to visit school at the end of the school day in order to encourage safe and considerate driving and parking and to deter anything less than this.

Please do not park on the pavements around school – all our parents and children need to use these at arrival and dismissal in order to stay safe and socially distanced. Nobody should be forced to walk in the road because cars are on the footpath.

Many thanks in advance for your continuing cooperation and consideration in keeping all our pupils safe at the start and end of the day on the roads around school.

OUR HOME LEARNING POLICY OCTOBER 2020 ONWARDS

It is vital that children at St Richard's continue to make excellent progress in their learning in the event of the need to self-isolate or if we were closed to all or most of our pupils any time in the future. We have therefore published updated home-learning resources on our website. We are recommending a <u>minimum of</u> <u>two hours</u> of good-quality home learning per pupil per day whilst children are not in school.
