## COVID 19 UPDATE FROM SCHOOL

Today we sent our Reception 2 bubble home to self-isolate following news of a confirmed positive case of COVID-19 in that class. Pupils and staff from R2 will be returning to school on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> November but must self-isolate until then. A letter with full details will be posted out tonight to all parents of pupils in R2.

## NEW COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS COME INTO FORCE TODAY

New national restrictions come into force today (Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> November) for 4 weeks until Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December as a result of rapidly rising COVID-19 cases nationally. **Schools (including ours) will remain open.** It is very important for children to continue to attend St Richard's, in order to support their wellbeing and educational progress. Senior clinicians still advise that school is the best place for children to be. At St Richard's we have a wide range of protective measures in place to keep everyone as safe as possible.

There are many things that we can all do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with COVID-19. Along with no household mixing and the recommended hand-washing and hygiene measures, **please keep two metres apart at the school gates.** We have a sign on Norton Avenue with these very words on it. Despite the challenges involved, it is very important that we all give each other as much space as possible during drop-off and pick-up in order to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

## FIRST HOLY COMMUNION UPDATE

As a consequence of the new restrictions coming into force today, we are having to postpone the next three First Holy Communion Masses which had been scheduled to take place on 5<sup>th</sup> November, 12<sup>th</sup> November and 19<sup>th</sup> November. When this national lockdown is over and the Covid-19 restrictions are lifted to allow for church services in places of worship again, we will inform you of the new dates for these three First Holy Communion Masses. Thanking you again for your patience, understanding and support during this year's rather unusual Sacramental Programme.

## REMEMBRANCE IN NOVEMBER

November is traditionally a month for remembering. On Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> November we celebrated the Feast of All Saints, when we remember all the triumphant saints in heaven. Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November was the Feast of All Souls. On this day we were asked to remember and pray for all who have died. November is also the month of Remembrance Sunday (Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> November this year) when we remember all those who sacrificed so much in both world wars and in conflicts since then.

Please check, amend and sign the form (sign and return even if there are no changes) so that we can update your details on our system. - A letter about how your child could lease to buy a new Chromebook through a new scheme that we are setting up at St Richard's with the aim of ensuring that all our pupils have access to online learning at home. It is also vital that the reply slip to this offer is completed and that your child returns it to their classteacher by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> November too.

## OUR HOME LEARNING POLICY OCTOBER 2020 ONWARDS

It is vital that children at St Richard's continue to make excellent progress in their learning in the event of the need to self-isolate or if we were closed to all or most of our pupils any time in the future. We have therefore published updated home-learning resources on our website. We are recommending a **minimum of two hours** of good-quality home learning per pupil per day whilst children are not in school.

## BBC BITESIZE DAILY

Starting from Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November, BBC Bitesize Daily will take over the CBBC TV channel for an hour every morning from 9am. There's an hour of dedicated programming for primary school children who are learning from home. The BBC will be showing three 20 minute lessons on CBBC each day:

- 5-7 year olds at 9am
- 7-9 year olds at 9.20am
- 9-11 year olds at 9.40am

The lessons will be useful as part of remote learning provision or as extra support for any children who have to self-isolate. All lessons are also available on the BBC iPlayer.
