NOTIFYING SCHOOL OF POSITIVE TEST RESULTS FOR COVID-19 OVER THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS

Until 3.30pm on Wednesday 23rd December, if your child tests positive for COVID-19, parents are asked to notify school via an email to <u>comments@st-richards.manchester.sch.uk</u>

The school will then identify possible close contacts of your child in school and – if necessary - advise self-isolation for other pupils and staff (as your child may have been infectious whilst in school). This advice to self-isolate will be via a ParentMail text.

The <u>comments@st-richards.manchester.sch.uk</u> email account will not be monitored after 3.30pm on Wednesday 23rd December. Even during this period, school staff will not be oncall at all times. Instead, there will be a limited period on each day where staff will check for notifications.

After 3.30pm on Wednesday 23rd December **the school must not be contacted**. Instead, parents and carers must contact NHS Test and Trace. If this happens, school do not need to be informed about an absence until the first day of the new term (Wednesday 6th January 2021).

PLEASE DO NOT GO INTO EACH OTHER'S HOUSES

At the time of writing, Manchester remains in the tier three ('very high') band of COVID-19 related restrictions. Amongst many other restrictions, in Tier 3:

you must not meet socially indoors or in most outdoor places with anybody you do not live with, or who is not in your support bubble. This includes in any private garden or at most outdoor venues.

<u>Please do not go into anyone else's house</u> and do not allow anyone into yours (unless they are in your support bubble). Please do not exceed the Christmas regulations in any way. By following the rules of Tier 3 we will help to suppress the spread of the virus – something we all want.

This procedure will continue each week during Spring Term 1 and will then be reviewed for its effectiveness.

CHANGES TO HOME LEARNING

In line with recently revised Government guidance, our home learning policy now states that we expect pupils to undertake a minimum of <u>three hours</u> of good-quality home learning per pupil per day whilst children are not in school (for example, if they are self-isolating).
