FULL SCHOOL RE-OPENING ON MONDAY 8th MARCH

On Monday 22nd February, the Prime Minister announced the government's plan for the return of all pupils to schools and colleges, as part of the roadmap for leaving lockdown.

St Richard's RC Primary School will be open for all pupils from Monday 8th March 2021. Attendance is mandatory and all parents are expected to send their child to school from Monday 8th March 2021 onwards.

Full details of entry and exit times and procedures will be published in next week's newsletter as well as on our school website but are likely to be very similar to the arrangements we had in place when we re-opened in September 2020.

The Department for Education (DfE) has stated: 'the overwhelming evidence is that the risk to children and young people from coronavirus (COVID-19) is low, but the risks to children and young people of being out of school and college are high and increase the longer restrictions on education are in force. Whilst education settings can be places where transmission occurs, there is no strong evidence of them driving largescale community transmission'.

PLEASE WEAR A MASK AT THE GATES

Once all children return to school on Monday 8th March, it is vital that all parents and carers wear a mask or other face covering every time they drop off and pick their children up. This is to reduce the risk of transmission at the school gates and is designed to protect everyone - parents, children and our staff. If you have an exemption from wearing a mask, please let a member of staff know. If you do not, please wear
