#### **FURTHER BUBBLE CLOSURE AT ST RICHARD'S**

On Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June our R1 Bubble was sent home as a result of a member of class testing positive for COVID-19. This means that R1 will have to self-isolate and learn from home using Google Classroom and paper-based resources until Monday 21<sup>st</sup> June. C13 Bubble will also return to school on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> June. Many thanks for your understanding and cooperation.

#### PRIME MINISTER ANNOUNCEMENT

The Prime Minister, Boris Johnson, <u>announced</u> on Monday evening, 14th June, that he was not able to say that the country has met all four tests for proceeding with Step 4 of the road map out of COVID-19 restrictions and that it is therefore sensible to wait just a little longer. The government's aim is that this will give time for the vaccination programme to protect people from the virus in light of the new variant. The Prime Minister said that he felt confident we will not need to wait beyond 19 July 2021 and that the government will monitor the position every day and if, after two weeks, the risk has diminished then Step 4 might proceed sooner.

In light of all this, please note that at St Richard's we are keeping all of our current protective measures in place at the very least until there is a further announcement on Step 4 of the roadmap. These measures will remain in place to help reduce transmission of the virus.

#### **DELTA VARIANT CONCERNS**

Greater Manchester remains an **Enhanced Response Area** due to the rise of COVID-19 cases in the region. As a result, it is very important that we all stick carefully to all the measures in place locally - including at our school - which are designed to reduce COVID-19 transmission, including parents maintaining social distance and wearing masks at drop-off and pick-up times.

### IF YOU ARE A CLOSE CONTACT OF SOMEONE WHO TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

David Regan (Director of Public Health for Manchester) has asked that all pupils who are identified as a contact of a positive Covid-19 case access PCR testing where this is age-appropriate. By using PCR testing, positive results can be sent for genomic sequencing at specialist laboratories, helping Public Health England (PHE) to identify variant of concern cases and their spread. It is therefore very important for everyone who has been identified as a contact to take a PCR test and stop any onward spread. Even if your PCR test result is negative, you must still self-isolate for the full ten days.

#### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

School attendance continues to be mandatory for all pupils and all the usual rules on school attendance apply. This includes parents' duty to ensure their child regularly attends school, and schools' and local authorities' ability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices, for poor attendance. The DfE – and the Governing Body of St Richard's - expects us to apply these rules. As restrictions begin to lift, we know some families may be looking to take holidays during term time. Please do not do this. Instead, parents should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission to take their children out of school on holiday as this will be unauthorised and may lead to a penalty notice/fine.

#### **INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL GUIDANCE**

The DfE has asked schools to remind parents that people should not travel to 'amber' and 'red' countries, and that strict rules on testing and quarantine remain in place to protect public health and the vaccination programme. 
