HAVE A SAFE AND HAPPY SUMMER HOLIDAY

Next week, our children break up for the summer holidays, on Wednesday 21st July. This is therefore the final newsletter of the academic year. We wish everyone a happy, peaceful and safe summer break and we look forward to our return to school on Wednesday 8th September 2021 at 8.58am (school gates will be open from 8.30am). The academic year 2021-22 will still present challenges to all schools but there will be much to really look forward to next year!

NATIONAL RESTRICTIONS TO END ON 19th JULY

On 12th July, the Prime Minister announced that the final easing of COVID-19 restrictions will proceed from Monday 19th July. Our pupils break up for the Summer holidays on Wednesday 21st July and so it makes little sense to change any of our systems of control so close to the end of the school year.

At St Richard's, all current protective measures will therefore remain in place at least until we break up for the Summer holidays.

Many of the systems that we put in place due to COVID-19 have had a positive impact at our school in other areas (such as behaviour and safeguarding) and so most of these will remain in place at the start of next academic year.

Information to parents about St Richard's school organisation and procedures for the start of next academic year will be placed on the home page of the school website by 4pm on Tuesday 20th July so that parents have this information before we break up for the Summer holidays. Please make sure that you read all this information carefully.

Perhaps most significantly, from the start of next academic year, pupils at St Richard's will no longer have to self-isolate if they have been in contact with a positive COVID-19 case (but they will have to self-isolate if they test positive themselves). We hope that – from the start of the Autumn term 2021 onwards - this change in government policy will significantly reduce the disruption and loss of learning that all pupils, parents and staff have experienced since the start of the pandemic.

SIMS PAY IS CHANGING ITS NAME

From 26th July SIMS Pay will be known as 'Pay360 Education Payments'. The way you make payments will be the same but the link to log in will be changed to pay360educationpayments.com. When you make a payment the details on your card statement will show as 'Pay360*StRichards'. We recommend that you add the new email address

<u>noreply@pay360educationpayments.com</u> to your contacts so the emails are not marked as spam.

This slip was included in the letter that went home on Tuesday 13th July. This slip must be returned to your child's Y6 teacher by Friday 16th July.
