YEAR 6 SATS WEEK MAY 2022

The Key Stage 2 SATS tests (which the DfE has confirmed Year 6 pupils will sit this academic year) are timetabled from Monday 9th May to Thursday 12th May 2022. It is vitally important that all our Year 6 pupils are in school for the whole of this week. Please make a note now in your diary or calendar.

COVID 19 UPDATE

Under the current national arrangements, if your child is a close contact of a positive case of COVID-19 and they are not displaying any COVID-19 symptoms, they will not have to self-isolate. We hope this means that we will have very few (if any) 'bubble closures' like we did last year.

However, in order to protect everyone in school (and at home) it is still vitally important that parents do not send their child to school if their child has any symptoms of COVID-19, however mild. The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature.
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours.
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

If your child demonstrates any of the above symptoms whilst they are in school, you will be contacted and asked to come for them immediately and keep them off school at least until your child has had the result of a PCR test. Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result – they can only leave home to have the test.

SAFE DROP-OFF AND PICK UP OF CHILDREN

It is not safe or acceptable (in fact, it is dangerous) for parents who drive their children to school to stop their car in the middle of the road and expect children to step into the road in order to get to school. Please give yourself enough time to park up (preferably a bit further away from school in order to avoid congestion) and then calmly walk the rest of the way to school. This will have a positive impact on everyone and is much safer for your child. Many thanks in advance for your full cooperation.

Manchester City Council will send offers of places to those who applied on-time on National Offer Day, 19th April 2022. Please remember a place in our Nursery does not guarantee a place in Reception.
