WE BREAK UP FOR HALF-TERM TOMORROW

We break up for our half-term holidays after school tomorrow, Friday 22^{nd} October. We wish you all a safe and restful half-term break. CHANGE OF AUTUMN TERM PARENTS EVENING DATE

We have changed the date of our Autumn Term Parents Evening from Wednesday 10th November to <u>Wednesday 17th November</u>. On the afternoon and early evening of Wednesday 17th November, we will be using a virtual parents' evening platform called 'School Cloud'. There will be short video call between parents and teachers (a bit like Zoom or FaceTime). This will last 5 minutes. You will be able to choose your own appointment times with teachers and you will receive an email confirming your appointments. We are confident that School Cloud will be easy to use, that parents will like it.

Full details will follow shortly after half-term about how parents will be able to book appointments using School Cloud's online booking system.

COVID-19 UPDATE

It is still vitally important that parents do not send their child to school if their child has any symptoms of COVID-19, however mild. The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature.
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours.
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.


If your child demonstrates any of the above symptoms whilst they are in school, you will be contacted and asked to come for them immediately and keep them off school at least until your child has had the result of a PCR test. Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result – they can only leave home to have the test.

Manchester Health Authority have also identified some common wider symptoms which parents should also be mindful of for both themselves and their children and which may lead you to taking a Lateral Flow Device or a PCR test. These symptoms are:

- Headache that lasts a long time
- Feeling tired and unwell
- Muscle or full body aches
- Sore throat
- Blocked nose or runny nose
- Diarrhoea, feeling sick or vomiting
