

SPRING TERM VIRTUAL PARENTS EVENING

We are holding a whole school virtual Parents Afternoon/Evening on Wednesday 23rd March 2022 (very similar to the one in the Autumn term 2021). Appointments will be available from 1.15pm – 3.15pm and from 4pm to 6pm. It is important that you make an appointment so that your child's class teacher can let you know how they are doing in school. All appointments will last 5 minutes.

We will again be using online software called 'School Cloud' for both the appointment booking system and the 5-minute video appointments with your child's class teacher. Your child will bring home a letter on Monday 14th March 2022 which clearly states the name of the teacher that you must make your parents evening appointment with. The School Cloud system works with mobile phones as well as laptops, PCs and tablets. You will be able to choose your own appointment times with teachers and you will receive an email confirming your appointment(s).

COVID-19 UPDATES

The Government has removed the legal requirement to selfisolate following a positive test. However, adults and children who test positive are still advised by the Government to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. In addition, the Government no longer asks fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days. Routine contact tracing has also ended. Staff, children and young people who are close contacts of someone with COVID-19 should attend their education settings as usual.

Please be aware that the DfE have advised all schools that, in the unlikely event of a parent insisting on their child attending school when they have a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, schools can take the decision to refuse the pupil if, in our reasonable judgement, it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND CARERS ON COVID-19 VACCINATION FOR AT RISK 5 TO 11 YEAR OLDS

The Department for Education has asked us to share the following information with parents and carers of at risk 5 to 11 year olds:

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the <u>Joint</u> <u>Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI)</u>. Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the <u>UK</u> <u>Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book</u>. Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.

Further information is available in the <u>guide for parents of</u> <u>children aged 5 to 11 years</u> published by UKHSA. We have published some <u>frequently asked questions</u> on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following <u>advice</u> from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.
