

BE ON THE LOOK-OUT FOR SCARLET FEVER

Hopefully you all received the paper letter from school on Monday about Scarlet fever. There has been a recent increase in the number of cases of scarlet fever across Greater Manchester. Scarlet fever is a highly contagious, bacterial infection that mostly affects young children (commonly between the ages of 2-8) and sometimes adults. It can spread very easily through coughing and sneezing, as well as coming into contact with an infected person. But, there are ways that we can limit how many people catch it. Please look out for these symptoms:

- Flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands (large lump on side of neck).
- A rash appears around 12 to 48 hours later. It looks like small, raised bumps and starts on the chest and abdominal or tummy area, then spreads. On white skin the rash looks pink or red. It may be harder to see on brown or black skin, but you can still feel it. In general, it makes skin feel rough, like sandpaper. If you notice any of these symptoms in yourself, or family members, please contact your GP as soon as possible. Most people will go on to make a full recovery and will be able to return to school or work 24 hours after starting antibiotics. In some rare cases scarlet fever can be dangerous, causing ear infection, throat abscess, sinusitis, pneumonia, meningitis and rheumatic fever.

Manchester City Council has approved funding for free school meal vouchers for **two weeks Easter break** for children eligible for free school meals to help with the financial pressures that many of our families will face. As St Richard's only has 1 week's holiday at Easter, the £30.00 that you will receive next week will be for 1 week at Easter and 1 week at the end of May (Our Whit holiday). Therefore, please be mindful when you receive the £30.00 vouchers next week that this is for 1 week at Easter and 1 week of the May holiday.
