Teachers will be acknowledging Cultural Diversity Day in class on Friday 20th May and will be undertaking some activity that draws on what the children know about their (and others') cultural traditions.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

On Friday 27th May we break up for our Whitsuntide half-term holidays. During these holidays, the Queen (and the nation) will celebrate her Platinum Jubilee. The Platinum Jubilee marks **70 years** of our monarch's reign. Queen Elizabeth II will be the first British monarch to reach this milestone. On Friday 27th May we will be celebrating this historic event by asking pupils and staff to dress in red, white and blue non-uniform. On this day, there will be some special learning and other events in school to mark the event.

SELECTING PUPILS FOR AFTER-SCHOOL CLUBS

In order to deal most fairly with greater demand than places available, a new arrangement for the allocation of places in our after-school clubs will be in operation for the final half-term. The present 'first come, first served' allocation of places will be replaced by a new merit system based on the Class Dojo rewards (or similar) given for good work and behaviour used in Key Stage 2 classes. Places will be given in each class to the eight pupils who have the most Dojo points (and who want to take part) in the school's free after-school sport provision. This will act as an incentive and reward for pupils who consistently work hard and behave well.
