# YEAR 6 GEOGRAPHY TRIPS TO QUARRY BANK IN STYAL

All of our Year 6 pupils will visit Quarry Bank in Styal this month as part of their Geography Learning Journey on Rivers. C13 (and some of C11) went on Tuesday this week. Michal writes, '*At Quarry Bank we learned about different kinds of maps and we did grid references. Pond-dipping was a big part of our experience. Looking over the little creatures was fun. We learned some new words like 'meander' and 'erosion' and, at the end, we did a river speed test and that was the end of our journey.*' Jayden added, 'It was brilliant, absolutely brilliant. In the first half of the day we focused more on experiments that determined which side of the water was faster. In the morning *we also dropped an apple in the river – the middle apple was fastest. In the afternoon we focussed more on the river and what is in it. We went pond dipping and our group found a variety of pond life, which we saw under a microscope.*'
