# **PENALTY NOTICE FINES ARE CHANGING**

From 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024, Penalty Notice Fines will increase from the current £120 to be paid within 28 days (reduced to £60 if paid within 21 days) to £160 to be paid within 28 days (which will be reduced to £80 if paid within the first 21 days). A letter was sent to every family last Friday regarding the increase.

The DfE states 'Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school'
