THIS SUNDAY IS PENTECOST SUNDAY

The Feast of Pentecost takes place on Sunday 19th May.

Whitsuntide is another name for Pentecost. Pentecost is known as the birthday of the Church and is the start of the Church's mission to the world. Pentecost is a happy festival. The first Pentecost came when people from many different nations were in Jerusalem, celebrating the Jewish festival of Shavuot. The Holy Spirit descended on the apostles. It arrived as a strong wind and it settled as



tongues of fire. The apostles soon found themselves speaking in foreign languages, inspired by the Holy Spirit.

SUMMER UNIFORM THIS TERM

Now that we are well into the Summer term, pupils may wear summer uniform. Summer uniform may be worn until the October half-term holidays. For girls, summer uniform consists of blue and white gingham dress. Girls may also wear white tights or black, white or grey socks as part of summer uniform. Boys' summer uniform consists of dark grey trousers or shorts, light blue polo shirt and plain navy school sweatshirt (preferably with the school logo and no other logo allowed).

Many thanks in advance for always sending your child to school in smart and full school uniform. Please remember that jewellery (including earrings) is not allowed in school under any circumstances and that all pupils should wear sensible black shoes.

FSM VOUCHERS OVER SUMMER HALF TERM HOLIDAYS

The council has agreed to fund free school meals vouchers over the May 2024 half term holidays, for children eligible for free school meals (FSM). Next week you will be issued with a £15 voucher per eligible child. As we previously advised, the other £15 was issued to eligible parents in April prior to the Easter one break, when £30.00 was issued.

This is advance notice that on Tuesday 21st May (next Tuesday) we will be celebrating UN Day of Cultural Diversity at St Richard's.
