A MESSAGE FROM MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL

'Do you need help now to keep warm, but you didn't get a Winter fuel payment? The changes to the winter fuel allowance have caused a lot of discussion and some worry. So, we wanted to make parents, carers, employees and their families aware of some help that is available on the Manchester City Council website - please see below:

Manchester City Council is making payments up to the end of March of £150-£200 to people who are aged 66 and over who live in Manchester and who also do not receive housing benefit or council tax support. The form is quick and easy to fill in and you won't be asked anything about any savings. This is the link: https://www.manchester.gov.uk/winterfuelfund
Payments will be made as promptly as possible to bank accounts or through post office vouchers. You will need to give contact details and your National Insurance number. Family members can make an application on your behalf. Or, if you need help filling in the form, please call for free on our cost-of-living advice line on 0800 023 2692.

Children with <u>diarrhoea or vomiting</u> must stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).
