THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

We are getting closer to Holy Week, when we focused on the Passion and Death of Jesus. In the Gospel of the fifth Sunday of Lent (this coming Sunday), some men catch a woman doing something wrong. They decide they want to punish her by killing her. They ask Jesus what to do, trying to trick Him. Jesus tells them whoever hasn't sinned can be the first one to hurt her. They all leave without hurting the woman, and Jesus forgives her. The reassuring message is that Jesus forgives. It also reminds us that, no matter how difficult or painful our lives may be at times,



there is always hope for new life and transformation through Jesus.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL VOUCHERS OVER EASTER HOLIDAYS

Manchester City Council has approved funding for free school meal (FSM) vouchers for children eligible for benefits-led free school meals. As in previous holidays, school will issue the vouchers to parents. Even though we only have a week and a day off at Easter, two weeks' vouchers will still be issued. This means that if MCC agrees to fund vouchers going forward (i.e. May half term), eligible families at St Richard's will only receive vouchers for one week at the two week May half-term.

NON-UNIFORM DAY TOMORROW

Tomorrow is a non-uniform day for all children at St Richard's. A reminder text has been sent via the school gateway app. Please ensure that you have your notifications switched on. The suggested



voluntary contribution is \pounds 1. All money raised will go towards school funds. Many thanks for your support.

SUMMER UNIFORM AFTER EASTER

From Tuesday 22nd April 2025, when we return to school after the Easter holidays, and as an alternative to winter uniform, pupils may wear summer uniform. Summer uniform may be worn until the October half-term holidays. For girls, summer uniform consists of a blue and white gingham dress. Girls may also wear white tights or black, white or grey socks as part of summer uniform. Boys' summer uniform consists of dark grey trousers or shorts, light blue polo shirt and plain navy school sweatshirt (preferably with the school logo and no other logo allowed).

PARK AND STRIDE

'Park and Stride' is a simple idea for families who live further away to still enjoy the benefits of walking to school. If you drive your child to school, please consider parking a ten-minute walk from school and completing their journey on foot. This reduces traffic congestion and road danger around our school gates whilst allowing children the chance to get active for the last part of their journey.
