FREE SCHOOL MEAL VOUCHERS OVER SUMMER

Manchester City Council have agreed to make a one-off payment of £50 per child eligible for free school meals (FSM) to help with the financial pressures that many of our families are currently facing. This one-off payment to eligible FSM pupils will be paid prior to the end of the summer term.

SUMMER READING CHALLENGE 2025

The theme for the Summer Reading Challenge 2025 is 'Story Garden'. It started on 1st July and runs until 13th September 2025. Children need to go along to the public library to pick up their joining card and sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge. There is no charge to join in. If children are not already library members, they can join on the day. There are no charges for library membership and borrowing, and no fines for books returned late. Children complete the challenge when they have borrowed (and returned) 6 library books.

SUMMER HOLIDAY ECO-CHALLENGES

Our Eco-Council have been working very hard this year on several projects in school including supporting biodiversity, recycling, saving energy, growing vegetables in our school garden and tackling littering. Over the summer holidays, see if you can challenge yourself to help the environment by trying some of these eco-friendly actions:

- Walk, cycle, or scoot instead of using the car when you can
- Turn off lights and unplug devices when you're not using them
- · Reuse and recycle as much as possible
- Spend time in nature and learn about local wildlife
- Pick up litter in your local area (with an adult's help!)
- Try Meat-Free Mondays with seasonal foods
- Make a bug hotel using natural and recycled materials to give insects a safe place to live
- Try growing a plant or vegetable—in your garden, in a pot, or even on a windowsill!
