Toilet twinning is our CAFOD Jubilee Pledge and part of our effort to be 'Pilgrims of Hope' in this special year for the Church. £300 raised from non-uniform days has been donated towards this very worthy cause. SAFE4SUMMER 2025

FREE SCHOOL MEAL VOUCHERS OVER SUMMER HOLIDAYS

Manchester City Council have agreed to make a one-off payment of £50 per child eligible for free school meals (FSM) to help with the financial pressures that many of our families are currently facing. This one-off payment to eligible FSM pupils is to be paid prior to the end of the summer term.

If children are not already library members, they can join on the day. There are no charges for library membership and borrowing, and no fines for books returned late. Children complete the challenge when they have borrowed (and returned) 6 library books.
