## **APPLYING FOR A RECEPTION PLACE FOR SEPTEMBER 2026**

If your child's date of birth is between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2021 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2022 and they are due to start primary school in September 2026 and you live in Manchester, then please follow this link to make an online application: [https://www.manchester.gov.uk/info/500321/primary\\_school\\_admissions/7264/apply\\_for\\_a\\_reception\\_class\\_place\\_for\\_september\\_2018](https://www.manchester.gov.uk/info/500321/primary_school_admissions/7264/apply_for_a_reception_class_place_for_september_2018) If you live outside Manchester and want a place at a Manchester school, you need to apply through your current local council. The application round for Reception 2026 school places is currently open but the deadline for submitting an on-time application is only a week away - **Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2026**. Our school office staff can help parents who may be experiencing difficulties with submitting their applications online.
